Framework for the Parish Co Responsibility Group [PCRG]

- 1. The PCRG is embedded in the adage, "*That which affects, concerns, touches all should be dealt with, supported, discussed, and approved by all.*"¹
- 2. The primary focus of the PCRG is to implant the new Parish Vision in the four overarching ministries of parish systems, namely evangelisation and discipleship, fellowship, worship and communications.²
- 3. The PCRG is made up of four lay members and the parish priest; the tenure of this lay membership is for an indeterminate period.
- 4. The members of the PCRG have a significant leadership role within the parish as they oversee and develop other leaders within their ministry of responsibility.
- 5. Each member of the PCRG has a ministry description which outlines their main responsibilities and expectations.
- 6. As and when needed the PCRG uses outside advisers to further the strategy for the achievement of the parish vision.
- 7. The PCRG meets once a fortnight with the expectation that all members will attend.
